Leaders' meeting



Leaders Meeting – 3rd September 2025

Welcome back – District are working with GLV's and wider team members inviting feedback on what support they would like to see from District.

1. Safety and updates

Anything SlamFest related, District are already aware of.

A reminder of incidents which require reporting to Scout Headquarters. You need to submit a report if:

- Someone suffers a personal injury or illness and needs to seek medical help or advice. This may include a GP, hospital, clinic or dentist;
- Someone needs an emergency service such as an ambulance, mountain rescue or the police; or
- There is damage to third party property.

Near misses also need reporting to Scout Headquarters.

Please make sure any safety and safeguarding training is kept up-to-date. Suspensions will be put in place for non-compliance.

Reminder of the yellow card procedure for reporting safeguarding concerns/incidents. All such reports need to go direct to headquarters.

NAN approval team will be taking a closer look at NAN forms to make sure they include details which cover alcohol consumption on camp. The green card needs to be followed and controls should be included on the camp risk assessment. This could include confirming whether it will be a dry camp or confirming what plans are in place to ensure ratios are maintained and green card is followed.

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2. Challenge 26 - 10th – 12th July 2026

District Lead is required for this event. The role will include:

- Liaising with county
- Planning district infrastructure
- Co-ordinating smaller district sub-teams

Catering is something which we need to give further consideration to as a district and likely invite further comments from GLV's about what catering arrangements groups would prefer. The main options would be either be either central catering from district, or groups arranging their own catering or catering in small clusters.

Back to basics camp with different traditional scout bases **for those aged 9 to 12 years old on the date of the camp (older Cubs/ younger Scouts).**

Bases we would like to run include:

- Stoves (showing different types) – including a bit of cooking
- Knife and axe skills
- Fire lighting
- Knots and lashings / pioneering
- Putting up a tent / Patrol tent / types of pegs.
- What to pack

Young people to rotate around the above basis and then everybody would split into groups to cook their own evening meal on a fire.

Cost: £15 per person (plus group food)

The competition this year is largely unchanged save for some changes to the rules around the food.

The requirement for a one pot stew and the requirement for the custard to be powdered has been removed and replaced simply with a requirement to do a hot main meal and a hot dessert. This would leave the cooking requirements as follows:

- Saturday lunch – packed lunch
- Saturday tea – hot main meal and hot dessert
- Sunday breakfast – required to have at least 4 hot items
- Sunday lunch – cold buffet/sandwiches.

Teams of minimum of 4, maximum of 7.

All teams will still need to do a skit.

Darren needs confirmation of the number of teams you are entering and how many leaders will be attending including leaders name and any leaders dietary requirements.

Final numbers need to be submitted by 19th September 2025.

Groups to submit their own NAN's, unless they don't have a NAP holder in which case they can attach to another group.
